

**SEATTLE CENTER COVID-19 HEALTH SAFETY**  
**FACE COVERING & PHYSICAL DISTANCING PROTOCOLS**

*Updated September 3, 2021*

King County and the City of Seattle require all guests to City facilities, including Seattle Center facilities, to follow the health safety protocols below. This includes any event staff, volunteers, vendors, suppliers, performers\*, and patrons/guests.

- When indoors:
  - All individuals must be masked, regardless of vaccination status
- When outdoors:
  - All individuals, regardless of vaccination status, must be masked at events with *500 people or more*
  - Unvaccinated individuals must always be masked *AND* maintain 6' of physical distance
  - Vaccinated individuals do not need to be masked or maintain 6' of physical distance when attending events with *fewer than 500 people*
  - Seattle Center/City of Seattle staff are required to be masked wherever there are crowds, and when 6' of physical distance cannot be maintained
- Mask exceptions:
  - Masks can be removed when the individual is *actively* eating/drinking or presenting/performing
  - Masks are not required for children under the age of five
  - Masks are not required for individuals with a disability, medical or health condition that a protective face covering would impair or impede

Your event's COVID-19 health safety plan must, at minimum, align with the above health safety protocols, and can be more restrictive.

*\*Please liaise with your Event Representative regarding health safety protocols for performers while they are performing. When not performing, performers must adhere to the protocols above.*
